The Department of Civil Engineering at the **University of Arkansas** invites applications for a tenure-track/tenured position at the Assistant/Associate Professor level (commensurate with experience). Candidates with an expertise in structural engineering, having experience with large-scale experimental testing, are encouraged to apply.

The Department of Civil Engineering has 18 full-time faculty members and approximately 270 undergraduates (sophomore through senior) and 50 graduate students. The Department offers an ABET accredited BS degree as well as MS and PhD degrees in Civil Engineering. Active research programs exist in environmental, geotechnical, materials, structural, and transportation engineering. In 2015, research expenditures for the Department were approximately \$2.3 million.

The individual selected for this position will be expected to possess the following required qualifications:

1. A Ph.D. in Civil Engineering or a closely related field is required. (Must be earned by August 2017).
2. Registration as a licensed professional engineer (P.E.) in Arkansas is required before tenure is awarded.
3. Must have or develop an active research agenda in structural engineering, provide evidence of scholarly productivity through publication and service, and exhibit a commitment to teaching excellence.

Preferred Qualifications:

1. Teaching experience in the field of civil engineering or closely related discipline in an accredited institution of higher education.
2. Demonstrated ability to secure research funding from granting agencies through a competitive proposal process.
3. Passing status on the Fundamentals of Engineering Exams (F.E.) at the time of application.

To be considered for the position, applicants are asked to provide a cover letter, complete CV, teaching and research statements, and contact information for three professional references.
